We know the struggles that young people have and we want them to know that they can trust us - we can not fail them in any way.

We believe that it is important to be sensitive and aware of the way we communicate with each other, as well as with the people we help. In order to do that, we are committed to only use

inclusive language, to resign from any judgement and to ensure that we lead all of our actions by kindness. It is key to behave that way also on the internet and even if it might seem anonymous. We do not accept any form of hate-speech or bullying at The Youth Group. If we witness such behaviours, even online, we are committed to act immediately and solve the issue.

By being a part of The Youth Group, we have access to information that shouldn't be widely shared and our rule is to always protect it. We are extremely careful when dealing with any sensitive information, as we are aware that we have young people's trust and do not want to let them down. In line with our Speak Up Policy, we ensure that anyone who has any concerns about cybersecurity at The Youth Group is not afraid to speak up and we encourage such behaviours. We want to state that they will always be listened to and all the actions will be taken if necessary.
